



On Friday, May 3, Chicago Fair Trade is organizing our 11th annual World Fair Trade Day event—always the largest in the US—**A Magnificent Mile of Fair Trade.** This event will take place along Chicago's most iconic shopping district with Fourth Presbyterian Church serving as the hub. The day involves a series of activities from 10 am to 8 pm celebrating the power of fair trade, while highlighting Chicago's leading role in this growing movement. Activities include:

- **Event kick off at 10 a.m.** Fair trade coffee & hot chocolate toast to Whitney Young High School students to celebrate becoming Chicago's first Fair Trade School;
- **Fair Trade food and beverage giveaways and tastings** throughout the day. We'll end the day with a Fair Trade Social with fair trade bites and sips from **Event kick off at 10 a.m.** Fair trade coffee and hot chocolate toast to Whitney Young High School students to celebrate their designation as Chicago's first Fair Trade School;
- A **Fair Trade Pop-Up Home** (May 3-5) Walk through the courtyard to the historic 1914 clergy house to experience the beauty and breadth of Fair Trade products in three room settings. Be inspired! Bring some of these ideas to your own home. Take a tour led by a Fair Trade Docent.
- A **Fair Trade Pop-Up Boutique** Shop from more than two dozen Chicago Fair Trade business members. The range of products, the quality, and uniqueness will amaze — and your spending dollars will support Fair Trade principles;
- **Evan the Chef's Fair Trade Pop-Up Bake Shop.** Shop the bakery delights of Chicago philanthropist, culinary star and MasterChef Junior finalist Evan Robinson. Taste the goodness of Fair Trade sugar, spices, chocolate and more. Proceeds to benefit Dreamcatcher Foundation and their work to end human trafficking.

And, of course, we'll take this opportunity to educate and share the message of fair trade. Fair trade experts will share their experiences and, once again, WBEZ's Jerome McDonnell will broadcast his WorldView program live. Community partners include Slow Food Chicago, Illinois B Corps, United Nations Association-Chicago, Whitney Young High School, Chicago Furniture Bank, and more.
